The iPrepared 2 project is designed to enhance resilience in areas highly vulnerable to natural and human-induced hazards. Building on the success of the initial iPrepared Project, which also aimed to strengthen disaster resilience primarily in BARMM through capacity-building, proactive climate-informed planning, and sustainable risk reduction strategies, iPrepared 2 scales up these proven interventions for broader impact.

With the funding support of the United States Agency for International Development's Bureau for Humanitarian Assistance (USAID-BHA), iPrepared 2 is implemented by Action Against Hunger together with the Integrated Mindanaoans Association for Natives (IMAN).

Specifically, the project aims to support and contribute to the enhancement of disaster and climate resilience capacities of the BARMM Region, the Province of Palawan, select municipal local government units, local stakeholders, communities and households through climate and risk-informed preparedness mitigation and response planning and awareness.

Building Community Awareness/Mobilization

- Support the conduct of multi-sector participatory climate and disaster assessment.
- Support the Development /enhancement of Climate and Disaster preparedness, early warning protocols, and rapid response mechanisms.
- Support the review and enhancement of an Inclusive Disaster Risk Reduction and Contingency Planning
- Enhance or Improve Disaster Risk Assessment (CDRA) or Local Climate Change Action Plan (LCCAP).

WATER SANITATION AND HYGIENE

Water Supply

- Technical Assessments of existing WASH services, coverage in the targeted communities and WASH In Emergency (WIE) capacity.
- Conduct WIE and Operations and Maintenance (O&M) training for LGUs/ stakeholders.
- Provision of O&M equipment kits for LGUs/stakeholders Repair/ Rehabilitation/ Construction of WASH facilities.
- Conduct of Water Safety Plan (WSP) training for trainers and implementers and development/ improvement of Water Safety Plans (WSP).
- Activation of LGU WASH Council to integrate water security framework and technical and mobilization support to establish ground water control and monitoring.
- Awareness raising on HH-level water conservation, safe management, and climate change using BCC strategies. Conduct of WASH in Emergency Training (WIE) and Basic Sanitation Course LGU.



iPREPARED is implemented by Action Against Hunger through the United States Agency for International Development's Bureau for Humanitarian Assistance (USAID-BHA) funding.

The goal of the project is to build inclusive and gender-equal disaster preparedness capacities of local government units and communities in areas vulnerable to natural and human-induced hazards in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region of Muslim Mindanao (BARMM), Mindanao, Philippines.

This goal focuses on building capacities and partnerships for preparedness and resilience of vulnerable indigenous peoples and local communities, amplify and enable a whole-of-system approach for women and other sectors to lead climate and disaster action to strengthen governance's responsiveness and effective preparedness actions.
