The Resilient Island Local Government Units Actions for Disaster Preparedness and Climate Change (Resilient IsLA) project aims to reduce the impacts of climate-related risks in the island communities of Siargao and Limasawa by strengthening their resilience and natural resource management capacities while addressing their basic needs.

Operating on a local scale, the project establishes close cooperation with local government units, agencies, and civil society organizations in implementing multisectoral interventions with climate change adaptation strategies at its core.

Funded by the United States Agency for International Development's Bureau for Humanitarian Assistance (USAID-BHA), Resilient IsLA is implemented by Action Against Hunger and the Assistance and Cooperation for Community Resilience and Development, Inc (ACCORD) Inc. in Siargao, Surigao del Norte and Limasawa, Southern Leyte respectively.
